QUESTION OF: Protection of inhabitants of the Central African Republic concerning

rebels

SUBMITTER: The People's Republic of China

THE FOURTH COMMITTEE OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

Deeply concerned that children are involved as soldiers and rebels in armed conflicts in African countries,

Fully alarmed by the deaths of innocent civilians also including children and women,

Realizing that more than 200,000 inhabitants have fled and are living under inhuman living conditions such as suffering from food shortages,

Deeply disturbed by the fact that neither the government nor the rebels stick to the signed peace agreements which resulted from the Central African Republic Bush War that ended in 2007 in order to establish a peaceful-living together-side by side,

Keeping in mind that there is no elected and stable government in the Central African Republic (CAR) due to the fact that the former president Francois Bozizè fled the country and Seleka leader Michel Djotodia took over the country's governance,

Believing the rebels could be an example for other country's rebels and this could lead to other revolutions and civil wars.

Having studied Human Rights Watch reports which show infringements committed by the Seleka rebels such as abuse of women, pillage, rape, executions and torture,

- 1. <u>Emphasizes</u> the importance to reintroduce suspended countries in the African Union, in order to prevent other conflicts in e.g. the Central African Republic and other African countries such as but not limited to:
 - a) the Arab Republic of Egypt,
 - b) the Central African Republic;
- 2. Calls upon the government of the CAR to:

- a) accept Chinese politicians forming a provisional government together with local politicians in order to:
 - i. establish communism,
 - ii. use a one-party system as a form of governance,
- b) restructure the distribution of wealth in the Central African Republic to guarantee equal opportunities to every inhabitant;
- 3. <u>Considers</u> starting programs to train the army of the Central African Republic with the aim of:
 - a) forming new employments,
 - b) lowering the army's propensity towards violence,
 - c) solving problems before they can occur as serious conflicts,
 - d) procuring peaceful solutions for conflicts without the use of violence;
- 4. <u>Proclaims</u> to support the improvement of the education system in the Central African Republic by:
 - a) educating more adults to overcome the lack of teachers,
 - b) investing in the construction of schools and kindergartens,
 - c) extending the compulsory education from the age of 14 to the age of 16,
 - d) sending Chinese supporters to all sections of social work like schools;
- 5. <u>Further invites</u> all responsible member states economy's to increase trade with the CAR by offering:
 - a) an improvement of CAR's economic importance,
 - b) making use of the existing natural resources such as but not limited to uranium, diamonds, gold, iron ore and copper,
 - c) the fight against poverty;
- 6. <u>Urges</u> the Central African Republic to punish the rebels with imprisonment;
- 7. <u>Encourages</u> all UN member states to support already existing help organizations by donating money to such as but not limited to:
 - a) African Children Haven,
 - b) Akilah Institute for Women,
 - c) EcoAgriculture Partners;
- 8. <u>Calls upon</u> all interested member states to found new organizations which show the inhabitants of the Central African Republic to protect themselves by strengthening the community in order to protect especially young people

from joining terrorist or rebel groups;

9. <u>Reaffirms</u> the necessity of establishing safeguarded zones in the CAR by instructing inhabitants to for example build fences and walls around their villages.
