Now there is nothing left to say but to wish everyone a wonderful conference with fruitful debates, new friends and the opportunity to find creative solutions with people from around the world.



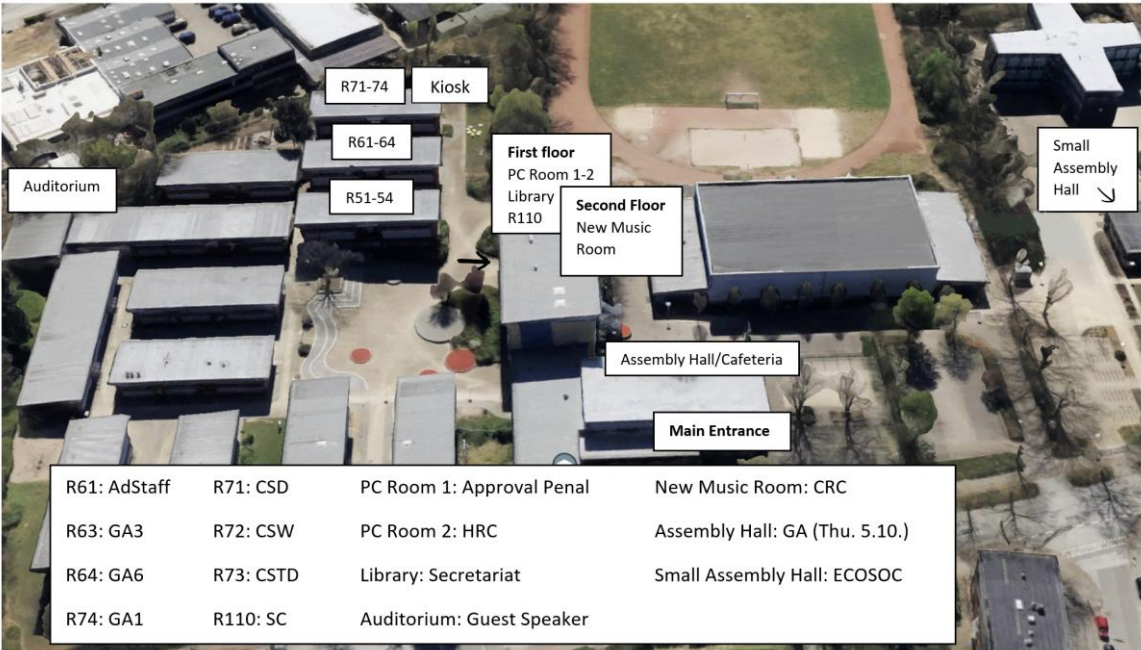

## Guest Speaker

### Get to know the organizations of our guest speakers!

#### **GREENPEACE**

Greenpeace is a *transnational political non-profit organization* that advocates for environmental, nature, and climate protection, as well as peace. They were founded in 1971 and have more than three million supporters worldwide. Greenpeace is committed to protecting the natural foundations of human and animal life through direct, non-violent actions. They are involved in various campaigns such as climate protection, species conservation, and the fight against plastic waste.

**Markus Power** talks about the Personal responsibility we have in case of climate change, about sustainable consumption and about young people as the drivers of change.



#### **VIVA CON AGUA**

Viva con Agua is a *non-profit organization* that aims to improve access to clean drinking water, sanitation, and hygiene worldwide. The organization was founded in 2006 in Hamburg, Germany. Viva con Agua works with local partners in countries of the global south. The organization uses music, sports, and art to raise awareness and to fund their projects. Under the motto “Water for all - all for water” they try to create a world where everyone has access to clean drinking water and basic sanitation.

**Christian Wiebe** talks about the lack of water and the problems and risks of pumping out groundwater.



The Rape hurts foundation is a *non-profit, non-government organization* working with marginalized groups of people, especially rural women and children in Uganda. They are reaching out to over 10,000 survivors of sexual and gender based violence, human trafficking, as well as sex and modern day slavery. Currently, RHF operates in the rural poor regions of Jinja and Kamuli of Eastern Uganda focusing on health and care as well as socio-economic empowerment of girls and women.

**Hellen Lunkuse Waiswa Tanyinga** talks about emotional intelligence and social justice.



Amnesty International is a *non-governmental and non-profit organization* that works worldwide for human rights. It was founded in 1961 and 10 million people from over 150 countries are part of the campaign. Independent from any government, ideology, political interest or religion, Amnesty addresses different human right issue such as gender equality, children’s rights, LGBTQIA+ rights, access to abortion and freedom of expression.

**Tobias Quack** talks about human rights and how they can be enforced.
